PROGRAM DIRECTOR – WISCONSIN NATIVE AMERICAN TOBACCO NETWORK

The Program Director – WNATN will identify Tribal tobacco control issues, develop strategies and implement tobacco control programs within member communities. Works towards improving the quality of life for Tribal members through education, advocacy, program development and implementation relative to; traditional use and sacred use of tobacco; commercial and recreational use of tobacco; reduction in initiation ages; smoking and pregnancy; cessation with youth and adults; exposure to environmental tobacco smoke; and tobacco disparities. A vital component will be the organization and maintenance of an Inter-Tribal Tobacco Coalition in which this position will provide leadership for the main goals and objectives as set by the Wisconsin Ethnic Network Collaborative.

Working out of the Central Offices in Lac du Flambeau, WI, this position is full-time with benefits including; Annual/Personal Leave and Holiday Pay; Health, Dental, Life & AD&D, STD and LTD Insurance, FSA and 403(b) Retirement Plan. This full-time/full benefits position has a starting salary range of \$40,500 - \$45,000.

Qualifications

Bachelor's degree in a health and human service field required. Minimum three years of experience in health and human services or an equivalent combination of education and relevant experience. Experience with a Native American Tribal organization and/or not-for-profit agency preferred. Grant writing and funding experience preferred. Individual must possess: excellent verbal and written communication skills; professional demeanor and appearance; problem solving skills; ability to manage time effectively; self-motivation skills; work effectively under pressure; ability to build positive work relationships with internal and external customers; ability to interact professionally with a wide variety of people; speak in front of groups. Individual must be able to apply advanced reasoning skills to problem solving and use basic mathematical skills. Must possess valid driver's license and/or reliable transportation with adequate insurance and ability to travel.
